
FROM THE STACKS


Our librarian, Beverley Martin, suggested this month that we highlight two classics by author Rachel Naomi Remen, MD. Come see these and other treasures at the Hospice library.

AUTHOR SPOTLIGHT - RACHEL NAOMI REMEN, MD

Dr. Remen has a unique perspective on healing as a prominent physician, professor of medicine, therapist, and long-term survivor of chronic illness. In this deeply moving and down-to-earth collection of true stories, she shows us life in all its power and mystery, reminding us that the things we cannot measure may be the things that ultimately sustain and enrich our lives. *Kitchen Table Wisdom* addresses spiritual issues: suffering, meaning, love, faith, courage and miracles in the language and absolute authority of our own life experience.

Dr. Remen's grandfather, an orthodox rabbi and scholar of the Kabbalah, saw life as a web of connection and knew that everyone belonged to him, and that he belonged to everyone. He taught her that blessing one another is what fills our emptiness, heals our loneliness, and connects us more deeply to life. Life has given us many more blessings than we have allowed ourselves to receive. *My Grandfather's Blessings* is about how we can recognize and receive our blessings and bless the life in others. Serving others heals us. Through our service we will discover our own wholeness—and the way to restore hidden wholeness in the world.





FROM THE GARDEN

Our Horticulture Technician Mona, and her team of dedicated volunteers keep Hospice House gardens and grounds looking fabulous. Here she shares a little of what's going on in our own backyard.



Spring officially arrives March 20th! Here at the Hospice garden many flowers are blooming before then. The first to bloom is the Witch Hazel shrub that surrounds the round cement circle opposite the pond. Our five Witch Hazels usually bloom the first week of January; this year they were two weeks late. Their yellow star- shaped flower (shown above) is just fading now, but in the fall we get a beautiful yellow leaf color.

Under the Hazel shrubs, spring bulbs are starting to pop up: Crocus in white, yellow, purple and orange, Daffodils, Canasta Lily, Dog Tooth Lily in purple, Yellow Pagota, and White and Galanthus Snow Drops. We have five ferns: Lady, Autumn, Liquorice, Spiny Wood fern and Sword fern. We have a perennial called White Corydalis. On the fence, the Armandii Snowdrift Clematis will bloom soon with it's evergreen leaf, then the Montana Clematis and then the Honeysuckle. Nearby, a tall Magnolia tree ready to bloom. Across from the back deck is the Pink Dogwood which will also bloom soon and by the stairs to the back deck there is a Scented Viburnum.

At the front of the house under the Weeping Birch there is another spring show happening with Bluebells and Crocus. Hope you enjoy a walk through the garden soon.
